

JUNIOR SCHOLARSHIPS 2018 - *Circle or highlight scholarships you are interested in being considered for and submit this form and a copy of a resume to the guidance office before 3/1*

Champlain College - **Women in Technology Scholarship** \$10,000 annually. Selected female students will receive a scholarship to help them pursue a career in a technology based field such as Computer & Digital Forensics, Computer Networking & Cybersecurity, Computer Science & Innovation, Computer Information Technology or Game Programming.

Chatham University - **Rachel Carson Book Award** \$1,000 annually and a book award. Presented to a young woman interested in science and environmental studies who has a GPA of 80 or above.

Clarkson School of Clarkson University - **Clarkson School Scholarship** \$15,000 annually. Must be in the top 15% of the class, have an overall GPA 93 or higher, and *an interest in completing their senior year of high school at The Clarkson School.*

Clarkson University – **Clarkson Leadership Award** \$15,000 annually

Clarkson University – **Clarkson Achievement Award** \$12,000 annually

The Clarkson Leadership Award and the Clarkson Achievement Award are designed to annually recognize students who demonstrate strong leadership qualities, positively impact their high school and local community, and have a proven academic record.

Elmira College – **Elmira College Key Award** \$20,000 annually. This award of merit is presented to one male and one female in their junior year who has demonstrated outstanding school and community leadership. Must be in the top 10% of their class and have a minimum academic average of 90%

Lawrence Technological University - **Math and Science Excellence Award** - \$2,000 annually.. Must have an 80 or higher GPA, an 80 or higher in challenging math courses and one year of Chemistry or Physics, be an active and responsible citizen.

LeMoyne College – **LeMoyne College Heights Award** \$12,500 annually. The award is to recognize juniors who are “reaching for the Heights” in the classroom and in service to their school and community. Students must be ranked in the top 10% of their class, have at least a 90 average, scored a minimum of 50 on each of the three subsections on the PSAT and have made significant contributions to your school or community

Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute – **Rensselaer Medal** \$25,000 annually. Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute awards the Rensselaer Medal to promising secondary school students who have distinguished themselves in mathematics and science. Students must have an average of 90% or higher. To recognize the superlative academic achievement of young men and women, and to motivate students toward careers in science, engineering, and technology.

Rochester Institute of Technology – **Creativity and Innovation Award** \$7,000 annually. This award honors high school juniors (one male and one female) who have distinguished themselves academically, are active and involved members of their school and community, and have demonstrated outstanding achievement in innovation, creativity, or entrepreneurship. Students should be in top 10% of the class.

Rochester Institute of Technology – **Computing Medal and Scholarship Program** \$7,000 annually. This award honors high school juniors (one male and one female) who have distinguished themselves

academically, are active and involved members of their school and community, and demonstrate interest and ability in computing. Students should be in top 10% of the class.

Sage Colleges- **Student Sage Award** ranging from \$4000 to \$18,000 annually toward tuition at Russell Sage College or Sage College of Albany. The Student Sage Scholarship recognizes two students who are leaders, powerful communicators and are involved in school and the community by serving and inspiring others. Both candidates have demonstrated themselves as a young woman or young man in the junior class who embody The Sage Colleges motto: "To Be, To Know, To Do".

Saint Lawrence University - **Saint Lawrence St. Augsbury/North Country Scholarship**. Students selected as Augsbury/North Country Scholars are awarded a merit scholarship of \$27,000 per year for four years, should they decide to enroll at the University. Nominees who are not selected for the scholarship receive an award of \$18,000 per year for four years if they choose to attend St. Lawrence. Nominees must have a cumulative grade point average of 90 or higher at the end of six semesters.

Saint Michael's College – **The Saint Michael's College Book Award for Academic Achievement with a Social Conscience**. Ranging from \$12,000 to full tuition. Recognizes one male and one female student in the junior class who exhibit the characteristics of achievement in academics and community service. Students must excel academically and have a sustained sincere commitment to community service activities through high school.

University at Albany - **Multicultural High School Achievers Award** - Awarded to a junior of African American, Latino, Asian American or Native American descent, with an 88 or higher GPA and a record of outstanding school and community leadership.

University of Massachusetts in Lowell, MA - **Guidance Counselor Award** \$10,000 awarded to a junior with a GPA of 88 or higher and a SAT 1190 or ACT of 24.

University of Rochester – offers four separate scholarships, see details below and indicate preference.

Bausch & Lomb Honorary Science Award – Consideration for \$10,000- \$20,000 annually Each year, since 1933, The University of Rochester and Bausch and Lomb has honored outstanding science students with The Honorary Science Award Medal. This award is presented to a student in the junior class who, in the opinion of the Science Department, most reflects the image of the ideal science student.

Fredrick Douglas and Susan B. Anthony Award and Scholarship in Humanities and Social Sciences - Consideration for \$10,000 - \$20,000 annually. The humanities and social studies teach critical skills: how to think, how to read, how to reason - intellectual powers with the widest applications. Proficiency in these disciplines will help students understand society and the forces that move it, the historical currents that led us from the past to present, and the possibilities of the future.

George Eastman Young Leaders Program - Consideration for \$10,000 - \$20,000 annually. Recognizes outstanding achievement by high school juniors in leadership and academics by awarding the Kodak Young Leaders Award. Candidates have demonstrated strong leadership, grades, challenging coursework and extracurricular activities.

Xerox Award For innovation and Information Technology - Consideration for \$10,000 - \$20,000 annually. This award recognizes high school juniors that demonstrate outstanding achievement in the pursuit of innovative approaches and an appreciation for the possibilities of technology.

Washington University in St. Louis - **Danforth Scholars Program** - Full or partial tuition scholarship. Honors the student who embraces high ideals, whose life choices are guided by personal integrity, selflessness, a commitment to community, and a dedication to leadership and academic excellence. **(Awarded next fall.)**

Wells College – **21st Century Leadership Award** - \$10,000 annually. Selection made on the basis of school activities, community service, and academic achievements that identify candidates outstanding leaders. Top 15% of class.

(List any work experience you have had, even babysitting, mowing lawns or dishwashing, since grade 9)

References:

(List the names, addresses and phone numbers of two to four people, not related to you, who can speak about your character. You might choose teachers, coaches, bosses, etc. Be sure to ask someone who knows you well, and definitely ask first before listing someone as a reference.
